# Fastrack Route A service improvements

Improvements have been made to Fastrack Route A that are helping to make local travel even easier.

You can now buy your ticket on board the bus as well as from the roadside ticket machines. Period ticket and concessionary pass holders should now show their passes to the driver. Fastrack Route A now picks up at the Fastrack stop on the south side of Home Gardens – located just outside Waitrose – making it even more convenient to return from a shopping trip in Dartford town centre.


**Bus tickets** 

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The new m-ticket no longer requires scanners on the bus, it looks the same as a paper ticket, but on your mobile phone screen so you simply show your phone to the driver as you board. The new technology now works with Blackberries, and early in 2010 iPhones will also be supported.



### Southeastern's high speed service even better

Many Fastrack passengers will have tried Southeastern's high speed "preview service" between Ebbsfleet International and St Pancras International so will have so will have already experienced the convenience of high speed rail travel. But now the service is set to get even better!

From 13th December around 200 high speed services will operate every weekday between St Pancras, Ebbsfleet and a variety of destinations in Kent and Medway. This will be the first domestic high speed service in the UK. High Speed service trains will travel both on the dedicated HS1 track between St Pancras International and Ashford via Ebbsfleet and also on existing mainline rail tracks, offering convenient through travel and dramatically reduced journey times.

# Ebbsfleet. Closer than you think. Travel from London to Ebbsfleet in just 17 minutes on the UK's first high speed rail line.

#### Southeastern High Speed service -Facts and figures

From 13th December around 200 high speed services will operate every weekday.

It takes just 17 minutes to get from Ebbsfleet to St Pancras and only 20 minutes to Ashford.

29 six-carriage high speed trains will be used on the service.

Each train will seat 338 passengers in a 2+2 configuration and have a total capacity of around 500.

The trains are built in Japan by Hitachi and feature aluminium bodies for lightness and strength.

Trains will travel at up to 140mph on HS1 and up to 100mph on the mainline rail network.

## New opportunities for rail travel timetable

High Speed services are just one part of what will be the biggest change to the railway timetable in this part of the country for 40 years, with a completely new Southeastern timetable effective from 13th December.

As well as the 200 new high speed services running every weekday Southeastern will be adding 50 extra metro services on their busiest routes to accommodate the rising demand for transport in and out of London.

The new Southeastern timetable will include direct hourly services between St Pancras and Margate via Ashford and Canterbury, and Dover via Ashford and Folkestone as well as half hourly services to Faversham via the Medway Towns.

But it is the new opportunities for high speed travel into London St Pancras that feature in the new timetable. St Pancras offers passengers a variety of onward travel connections - more underground lines than at any other London train station; excellent bus services; and easy access to rail links to the North East, East Midlands and mainland Europe: and to the North West and West Midlands via London Euston, just one underground stop away.
